free, independent and in peace and tranquility

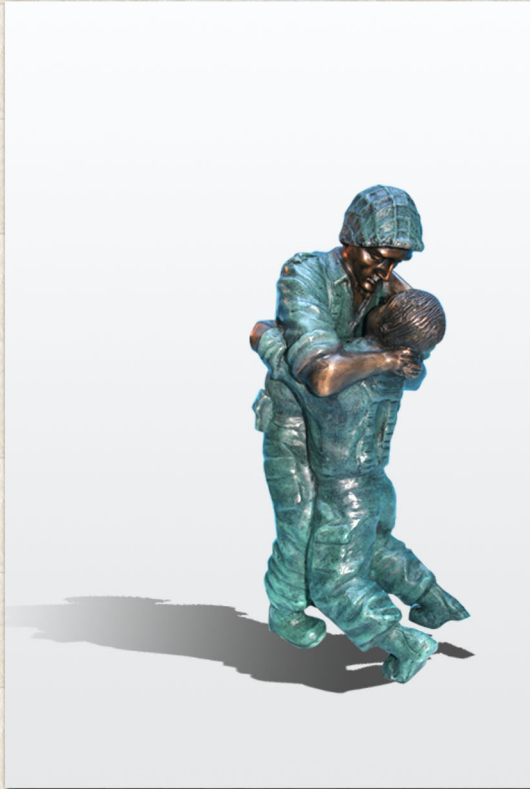

The dialogue he carries out with metal or stone in his works expresses strength as well as tenderness and compassion.

Among his famous work in Jerusalem are the bronze lion of Judah at the soldier memorial and the “Rock of the recruits” at the entrance to Ammunition Hill.
